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Course Description:

Math 3H: In this class you will learn concepts such as solving a polynomial, logarithms, trigonometry needed for calculus or other higher level math class.

Success in this class requires participation, dedication, and organization. It is important that students ask questions, take notes, complete assignments, and participate in class activities.

Tutoring

I am available from 7:00 A.M. until school starts and until 3:00 P.M. after school for students who need extra help. No appointment necessary. There will be before and after school tutoring offered Monday - Thursday. Schedules will be posted.

Material Requirements:

Students are required to come to class prepared to actively participate. Each student must have their own paper, pencil, notebook, and **calculator**. <u>Cell phones and iPods will not be allowed to be used as calculators!</u> Graphing calculators will be used extensively in this class. Students should obtain a TI-84+ graphing calculator to use throughout the year. A small number of calculators are available for rental from the school. You will also want your own set of colored pencils.

Tests, Quizzes & Projects-approx. 80%

Tests will be given at the end of each unit. No retake tests will be given. Missing class on a review day <u>does not</u> entitle you to take a test late. You will be required to take the test with the rest of the class unless you have made other arrangements with your teacher before the day of the test. To retake a quiz all assignments corresponding to the quiz must be completed and a retake ticket assignment must be completed. If you are absent the day of a test or quiz, you will take it in class the next day you are present.

Projects are an excellent way for students to demonstrate what they have learned. There will be at least one project assigned each quarter. Late projects will not be accepted!

Homework & In Class Assignments- approx. 20%

Students must show complete and accurate work to receive full credit on assignments!

Homework will be assigned most class periods and will be due the next day of class unless otherwise specified. You can redo any assignment up until the day of the test on that unit. Assignments that are due when a student is absent must be turned in the day he or she returns. Students will be given **one extra class period** to complete assignments that are assigned on the day of an absence. Students must grade their own absent work on their own time!

The day of the test for a unit is the deadline for all late, missing, or redone work for that unit. NO LATE WORK WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER THE TEST. Extenuating circumstances must be discussed with the teacher.

Notebooks will be graded at the end of each quarter. It will include a section for the disclosure, notes that have been taken the entire year, homework for the current quarter, and tests or quizzes for the current quarter. Three-ring binders are the best to keep your notebook organized.

Attendance is vital for success in this class. Please make every effort to be in class and on time every day.
